I have been a part of the college since 1999, first as an emergency temporary then later hired full-time as a Generalist in Curriculum and Instruction. I am very fortunate to have brought a wealth of successful experience to aid in my post-secondary teaching experience. I worked twenty-six years in elementary and middle school education as a teacher and administrator before being hired by the University of Louisiana at Lafayette. My fourteen years as a faculty member have been very rewarding for me on many levels. I have had the opportunity to help shape and prepare the young people entering the field of teaching, and as evidenced by my student evaluations, have obviously made an impact on many of my former students. I have also grown tremendously in my post-secondary experience in areas other than teaching. I have written papers for and made presentations at all levels: locally, regionally, state, nationally, and internationally. These presentations and papers certainly propelled me in a different direction from the classroom, but they awakened in me my desire to reach and hopefully impact even larger audiences. In addition to teaching and presenting, I wrote and received funding for many grants. As Director of the Summer Enrichment programs sponsored by the Center for Gifted Education for the years 2000 - 2009, I wrote grants to support the programs' operating costs and received awards in the amount of \$480,000. I have also been very involved in service to the college. I have served as Chairman of Standard 5 for NCATE accreditation for the past two accrediting cycles and I am Chairman of the Association of Childhood Education International (ACEI) and received National Recognition in 2009 on the report I submitted.
