I believe the art is about knowing your students, what they need, what they like, and where they are in the developmental process. I believe the science is about the tools we use to provide learning experiences, how we build these connections and make instructional decisions to help students reach their potential.

Bio - Christine J. Briggs, Ph.D. is an Associate Professor in Curriculum and Instruction and the Director for the Center for Gifted Education at the University of Louisiana at Lafayette. She teaches gifted education, research design, instructional coaching, capstone courses to masters' students, and reflections and professional development for senior candidates in education. Her professional contributions include: publications in Gifted Child Quarterly, Urban Education, Gifted Child Today, Journal for Journal of Literacy and Technology, NASET, serving as co-chair of the NAGC Curriculum Award, a member of the NAGC Awards committee and a member on the Council for Exceptional Children TAG Awards committee. She is currently on the board of Association for Gifted and Talented Students Louisiana (AGTSLA). AGTSLA is the state gifted organization where she serves a secretary.

She facilitates Masters Candidates' completion of their Capstone Projects as a culminating activity to earn a masters degree. in Gifted education. She has facilitated all of the projects for this program since 2006. Since 2016 she has taught the undergraduate course requiring seniors to complete an inquiry project within the second half of the yearlong residency placement. These projects reflect the goal of the UL's Advance and LaCoeur organizations.

Her research interests include continued advocacy for students of diversity and poverty to gain access to challenging and rigorous instruction to find their gifts and talents. Part of these efforts include the goal to expand the children's programs offered through the Center for Gifted Education to provide high level learning opportunities for students of diversity and poverty.
