# **Teaching Philosophy**

The purpose of education is to foster students' social and emotional development to allow them to develop a sophisticated understanding of themselves and the world. Educators should be equipped with pedagogical knowledge and resources needed to cultivate the skills students' need to pursue happiness and to achieve their potential as citizens at local, national, and global levels. To accomplish this goal, educators must provide learning experiences that are rigorous and relevant for students. Educators must be equipped with culturally relevant and sustaining pedagogical methods to meet the needs of students who come from diverse backgrounds including race, ethnicity, socio-economic status, language, gender, and learning or physical ability. Additionally, students should have opportunities to critically examine societal issues and consider how to take informed action to end poverty, oppression, and violence.

# **Biography**

Natalie Keefer is an Associate Professor of Social Studies Education and Graduate Coordinator at the University of Louisiana at Lafayette. She earned her Ph.D. in Curriculum and Instruction with a cognate in Anthropology from the University of South Florida. Dr. Keefer taught high school social studies for ten years and served as a world history team leader and curriculum trainer in Hillsborough County Public Schools. Dr. Keefer's research interests include educational anthropology, social justice, analysis of discourse, social studies pedagogy in French immersion contexts, citizenship education, human rights education, and mindfulness in K-16 education. She has published on these topics in the *Journal of Social Studies Education Research*, *Social Education, Social Studies and the Young Learner, The Social Studies, Teacher* 

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Education Quarterly, Research Issues in Contemporary Education, and has published chapters in various edited books. Dr. Keefer is also co-editor of the book Critical Perspectives on Teaching in the Southern United States.

# Teachers' Narratives of Experience with Social Class Advisor: J. Howard Johnston, Professor of Social Studies Education

## Summary

Dr. Keefer's narrative, phenomenological inquiry examined how five teachers in Tampa, Florida construct meaning about social class and academic achievement based on their experiences as members in a class-based society. Data produced descriptive, narrative stories that contextualize how meaning is constructed about social class based on participants' experiences. Findings indicated teachers' expressed deficit perspectives about students regardless of their experiences with social class. Also, data indicated that familial emotional support is an important factor that influences academic confidence and success.
